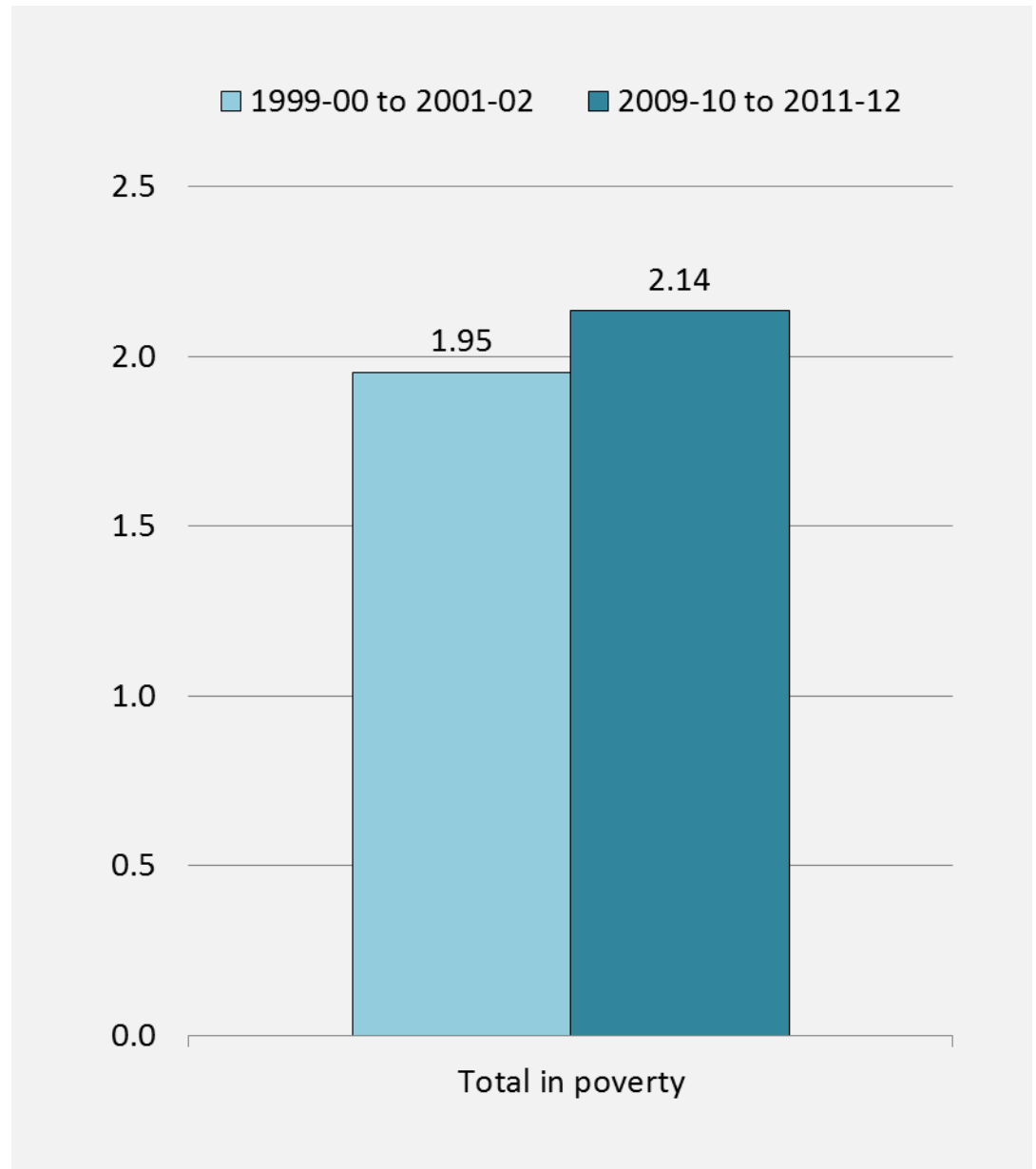

same type of people.



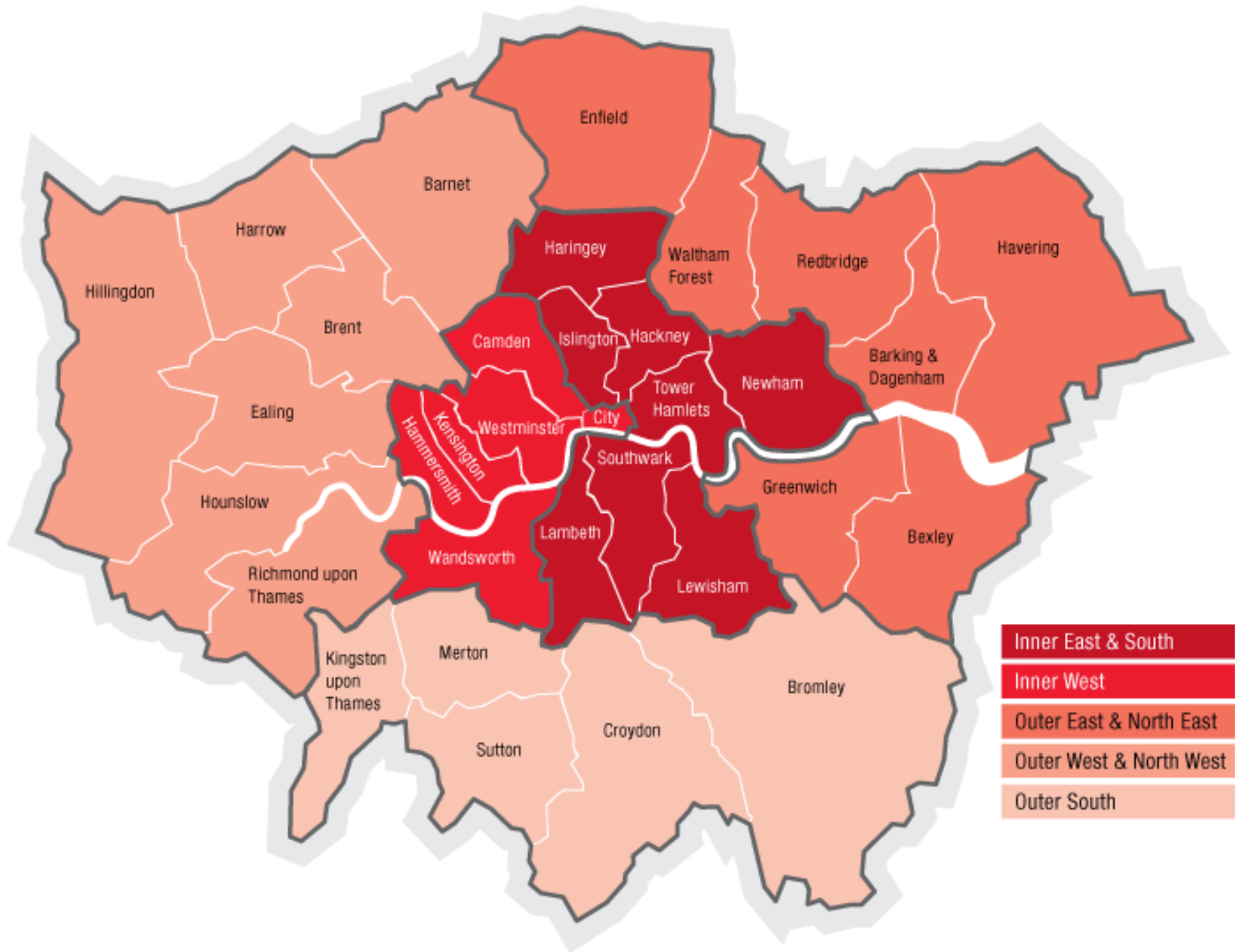
There have been changes by work tenure, and location

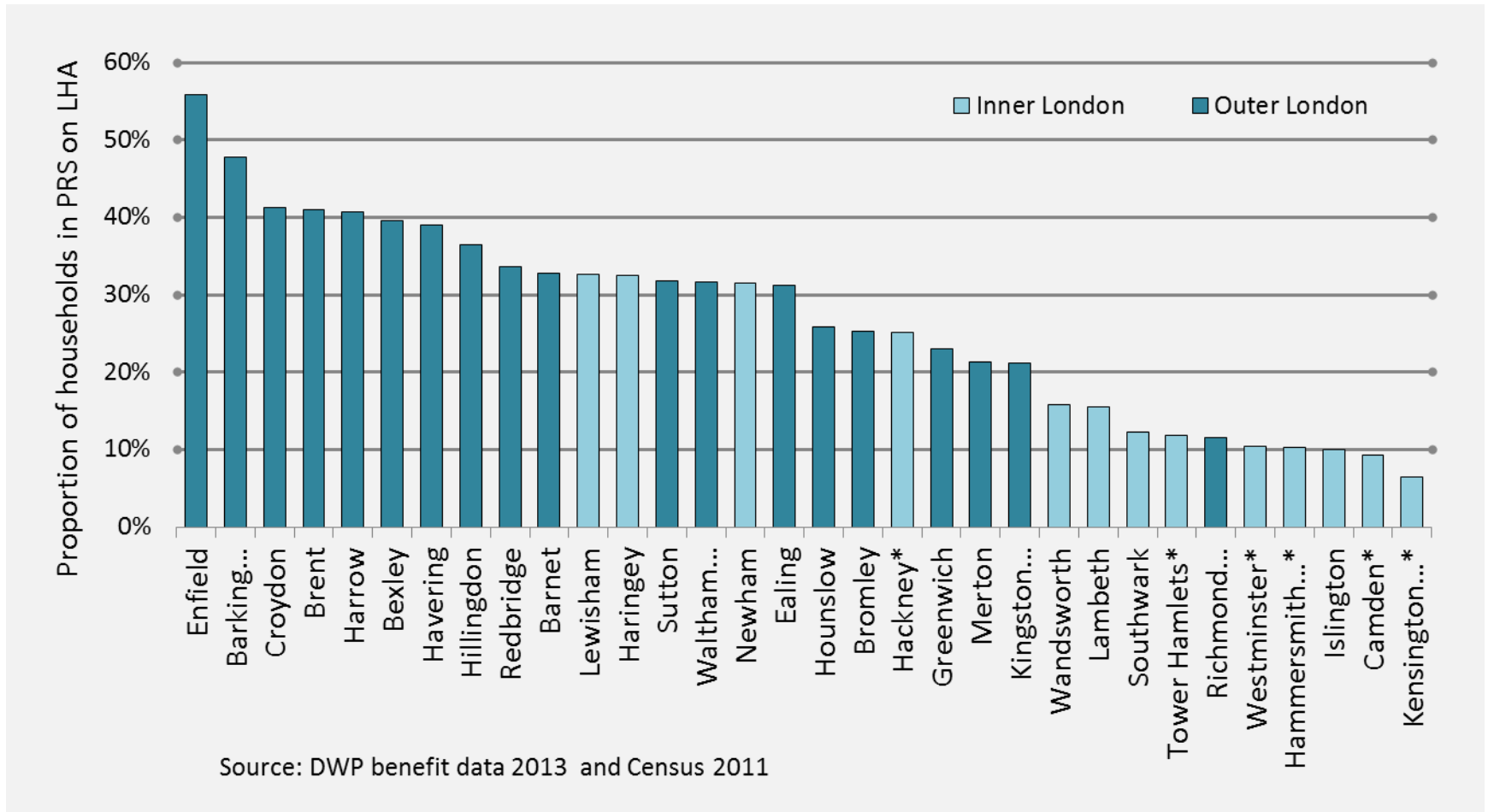
